From the Palme d'Or-winning *Anatomy of a Fall* by Justine Triet, to *The Worst Person in the World* by Joachim Trier, *Portrait of a Lady on Fire* by Céline Sciamma, and *Cold War* by Paweł Pawlikowski, mk2 Films champions bold, visionary storytelling.

Founded in 1974, mk2 Films is a home for auteurs — both established and emerging — whose work speaks to the present with artistry, clarity, and conviction.

A collection of over 1,000 titles forms a singular body of fiction, animation, and documentary, bringing together the timeless and the trailblazing: from Charlie Chaplin, François Truffaut and Agnès Varda, to Krzysztof Kieślowski, Abbas Kiarostami and David Lynch. Many of these works have been meticulously restored, preserving the power and beauty of cinema across generations. The collection traces a lineage from the earliest pioneers of the medium — Alice Guy-Blaché, D.W. Griffith — through Buster Keaton, Jacques Demy, and Claude Lanzmann, to some of today's most vital contemporary voices, including Xavier Dolan, Bruno Dumont, Leos Carax and Jia Zhang-Ke.

The newly restored version is selected to premiere in the Official Selection of the 78th Cannes Film Festival as the Opening Film of Cannes Classics

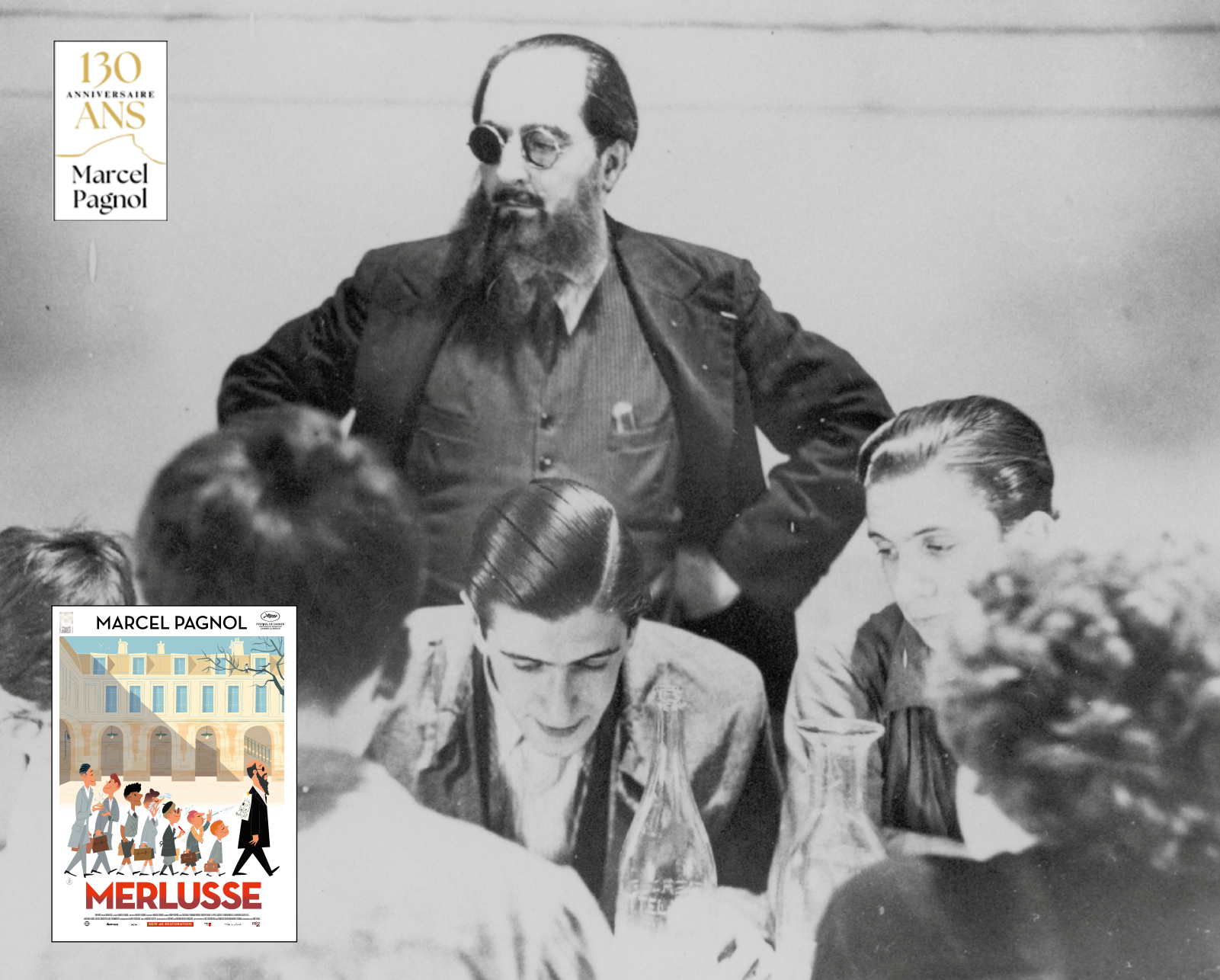

2025 marks the 130th anniversary of Marcel Pagnol's birth. The newly restored **4K** version of **MERLUSSE** is being presented as part of Cannes Classics. This film represents Marcel Pagnol's first original screenplay written specifically for the cinema. Filmed on location at Pagnol's former secondary school in Marseille during the winter holidays of 1935, this Christmas tale — centred on childhood memories and education — recently served as a source of inspiration for Alexander Payne's *The Holdovers*.

Marcel Pagnol's **MERLUSSE** was restored in **4K** in 2025 by CMF-MPC and the Cinémathèque française. With the support of the CNC, the Région Sud, and the Marcel Pagnol Endowment Fund. Restoration carried out by the Transperfect Media laboratory. Colour grading by Guillaume Schiffman.

In Marseille, the boarding school at Lycée Thiers empties as Christmas approaches. Just a handful of pupils from diverse backgrounds remain to spend the holidays there, under the austere watch of Blanchard — a one-eyed, much-feared school monitor known to all the boys as "Merlusse."

A restoration by The Film Foundation's World Cinema Project and the Cineteca di Bologna, carried out at the L'Image Retrouvée (Paris) and L'Immagine Ritrovata (Bologna) laboratories. The restoration was funded by the Hobson/Lucas Family Foundation. Three different cuts of the film exist; it was Mohamed Lakhdar Hamina's wish that the restoration reconstruct the version awarded the Palme d'Or.

MAGIRAMA consists of a program of four short films (*Auprès de ma blonde*, *Fête foraine*, *Château des nuages*, and *J'accuse*) shot in polyvision by Abel Gance and Nelly Kaplan.

Polyvision is a three-screen projection system first tested with *Napoléon* (1927). For **MAGIRAMA**, Abel Gance and Nelly Kaplan reused footage from previously filmed works, including a one-hour version of the 1937 film **J'ACCUSE**. This triptych format creates a new cinematic and viewing experience. Conceived in 1956 as an effort to 'save the dying cinema', **MAGIRAMA** was withdrawn from screens after just eight weeks. A rare cinematic experiment, now available to rediscover in a newly restored **4K** version!

The digitization and reconstruction of Abel Gance and Nelly Kaplan's program were carried out by the CNC laboratory, based on original elements deposited with the CNC. The restoration and calibration of *J'accuse* were carried out by the Transperfect laboratory. The soundtracks were restored by L.E. Diapason and Cinévolution.

On the occasion of the Official Selection of *The Chronology of Water* in Un Certain Regard at the 2025 Cannes Film Festival, mk2 films highlights the evolution of Kristen Stewart as an internationally acclaimed actress. Known for her bold choices and commitment to auteur cinema, Stewart first appeared at Cannes in 2012 with Walter Salles's **ON THE ROAD**, delivering a raw, free-spirited performance praised by *Rolling Stone* as "a live wire". She later reunited with Olivier Assayas for **PERSONAL SHOPPER**, which earned him Best Director in 2016. As she makes her directorial debut, Stewart affirms her artistic range and enduring presence on the international stage-described by Assayas as "the best actress of her generation."

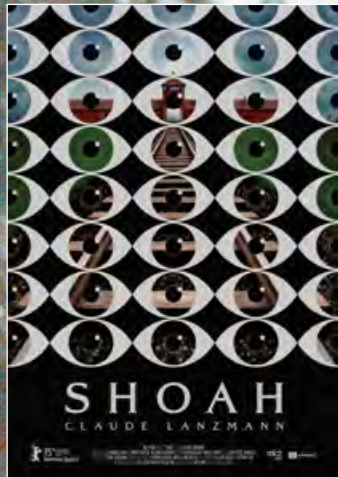

CLAUDE LANZMANN

Twelve years in the making, Claude Lanzmann’s monumental epic on the Holocaust features interviews with survivors, bystanders, and perpetrators across 14 countries. The film contains no historical footage; instead, it uses interviews to “reincarnate” the Jewish tragedy and revisits the sites where the crimes occurred. It stemmed from Lanzmann’s concern that the genocide, committed only 40 years earlier, was already fading from memory and that atrocity was being sanitised as history. His monumental work — both epic and intimate, immediate and definitive — is a triumph of form and content, uncovering hidden truths while redefining documentary filmmaking. The film recounts the extermination of six million European Jews during the Second World War and gave the event its name in many countries: the Shoah.

2025 marks several significant anniversaries: the 80th anniversary of Auschwitz’s liberation (January 27, 1945), the 40th anniversary of the French release of his landmark film **SHOAH** (April 30, 1985), and the centenary of Claude Lanzmann’s birth (November 27, 1925). **SHOAH** is inscribed in UNESCO’s Memory of the World Register as an indispensable historical record.

Heiny Srour made history in Lebanese cinema through her commitment, boldness, and uncompromising style. She became the first woman from the Arab world to be selected for the Cannes Film Festival with her debut film, **THE HOUR OF LIBERATION HAS ARRIVED**, in 1974, asserting a steadfast vision of feminist activism. Often involved in challenging shoots and ambitious projects where she risked her life, Heiny Srour sought to bear witness to a time that aimed to suppress women's rights.
