Griffith — through Buster Keaton, Jacques Demy, and Claude Lanzmann, to some of today's most vital contemporary voices, including Xavier Dolan, Bruno Dumont, Leos Carax and Jia Zhang-Ke.

Juliette Binoche's directorial debut IN-I IN MOTION offers a captivating immersion into the creative act, through never-before-seen footage of rehearsals and the staging of *In-I*.

mk2 Films is coordinating a 2026 worldwide release as a major cultural event.

In 2007, French actress Juliette Binoche and British dancer-choreographer Akram Khan stepped away from their established careers to embark on a bold artistic experiment. Over seven months, they co-created *In-I*, an intense, boundary-pushing performance they would go on to stage 100 times around the world.

Today, Juliette Binoche returns to that intimate journey. From the first spark of inspiration to the final applause, she retraces the emotional and creative arc of a singular collaboration. Drawing on dozens of hours of previously unseen footage, she reflects, as a filmmaker, on the nature of artistic creation, the vulnerability and exhilaration of taking risks, and the personal transformation they demand.

Premiered in 1938, HÔTEL DU NORD stands as one of Marcel Carné's most iconic works, emblematic of French poetic realism. 

Merchant Ivory's breakthrough, A ROOM WITH A VIEW (1985) launched Helena Bonham Carter and Daniel Day-Lewis while cementing James Ivory's reputation for intelligent romantic cinema. bashu, the little stranger

BAHRAM BEYZAIE

A landmark of Iranian cinema and a deeply humanist work, BASHU, THE LITTLE STRANGER blends realism with the quiet lyricism of a modern fable. Produced in 1985 with the support of Kanoon (the Iranian state institute that also backed Abbas Kiarostami's early films), the film stands as a sincere and enduring plea for tolerance, and a subtle critique of rigid social norms. In 1999, it was voted "the greatest Iranian film of all time" by a panel of 150 critics and professionals.

After his family is killed in a bombing, young Bashu flees southern Iran alone and arrives in a remote northern village. Unable to speak the local language and shunned as a little stranger, he is taken in by a mother of two whose husband is away. A fragile bond slowly begins to grow between them.

KRZYSZTOF KIEŚLOWSKI

Filmed in 1981 but suppressed by the Polish authorities until 1987, when it premiered in the Un Certain Regard section at Cannes, BLIND CHANCE marks a turning point in Krzysztof Kieślowski's career. This bold early exploration of fate, political identity, and moral ambiguity anticipates the metaphysical concerns of THE DECALOG and THE DOUBLE LIFE OF VÉRONIQUE.

CLAUDE LANZMANN

Twelve years in the making, Claude Lanzmann's monumental epic on the Holocaust features interviews with survivors, bystanders, and perpetrators across 14 countries. The film contains no historical footage; instead, it uses interviews to "reincarnate" the Jewish tragedy and revisits the sites where the crimes occurred. It stemmed from Lanzmann's concern that the genocide, committed only 40 years earlier, was already fading from memory and that atrocity was being sanitised as history. The film recounts the extermination of six million European Jews during the Second World War and gave the event its name in many countries: the Shoah.

2025 marks several significant anniversaries: the 80th anniversary of Auschwitz's liberation (January 27, 1945), the 40th anniversary of the French release of his landmark film SHOAH (April 30, 1985), and the beginning of the centenary celebrations of Claude Lanzmann's birth (starting in November 2025 and continuing for a year.)

SHOAH is inscribed in UNESCO's Memory of the World Register as an indispensable historical record.
